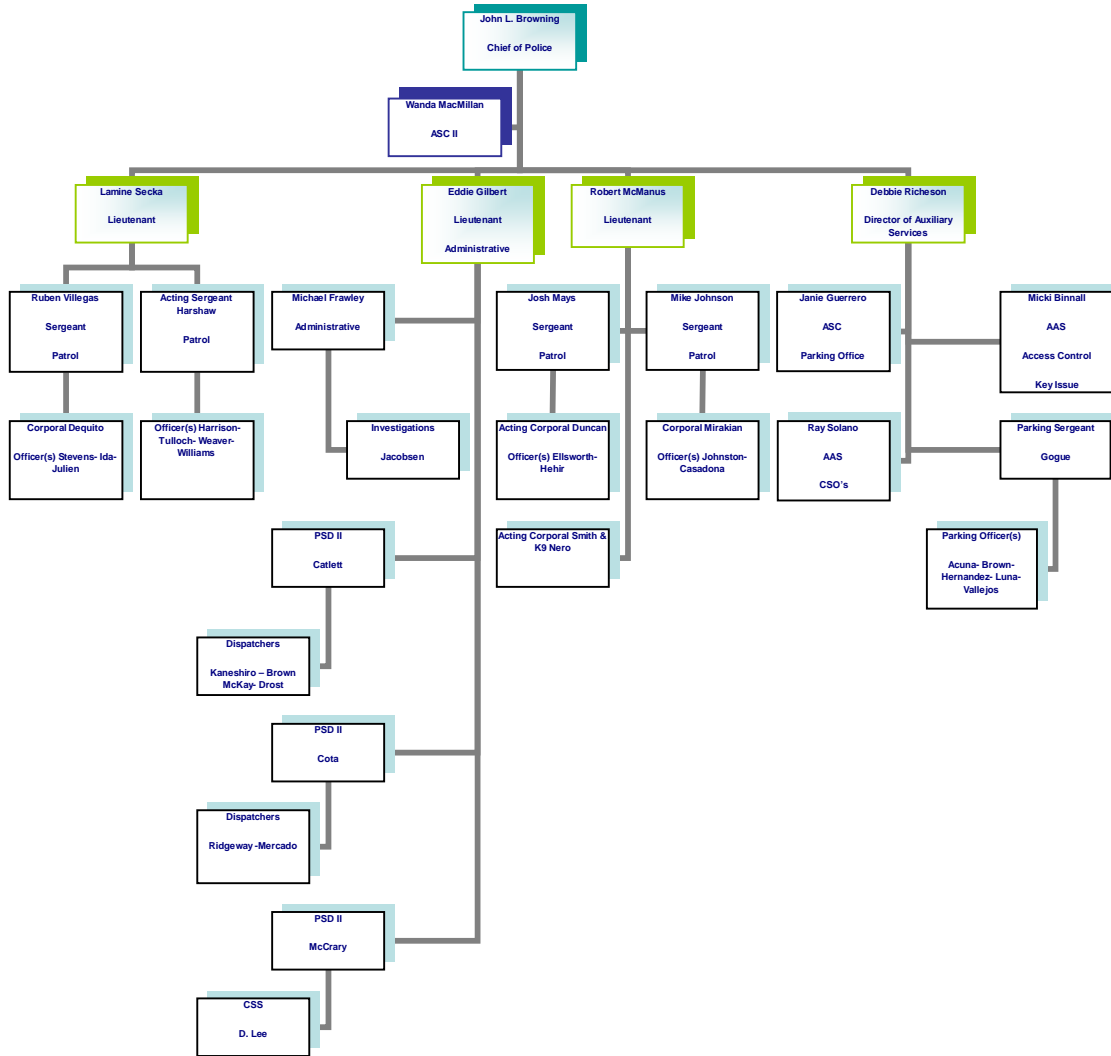

Operations Division

Achievements in 2006:

- Successful implementation of the security plan for the NCAA Tournament in March 2006.
- Successful move to new building July 2006.
- Promotion of (2) officers to the rank of Sergeant.
- Development of Public Information Officer Position allowing for one voice from the department to the media.
- Large methamphetamine arrest in Sept 2006 resulting in arrest of major drug dealer. Additional information passed on to DEA, FBI and Narcotics Task Force.
- Development of specialized unit for the Santa Margarita Ecological Preserve (SMER) to provide specialized enforcement to the area.
- Implementation and initial purchase of new CAD/RMS system.
- (2) Successful special enforcement task force operations with tremendous public support and attention. (Fall 2006)
- Continued participation in alcohol enforcement task force for San Diego County. Renewed current MOU for grant funding to continue in program.
- Initial development and ground work of narcotics detection K-9 program to start in Jan 2007. Revitalize the K9 Program. Officer Smith selected as the K-9 officer/handler.
- Maximize efforts to secure funding from non-traditional sources to implement additional police services that benefit the university community.
- Sgt Secka began prestigious MIDP coursework for Peace Officer Standards and Training (POST).



Operations Division

Goals & Objectives for 2007:

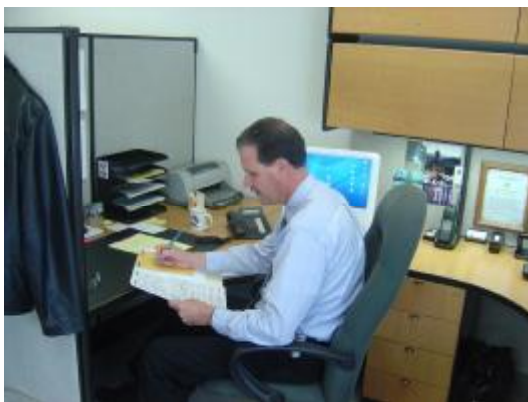
- Successfully launch K-9 program (complete patrol and narcotics training) by July 1, 2007.
- 2007 “Teddy Bear” Drive, obtain and donate 10,000 Teddy Bears to Children’s Hospital.
- Host the Semi-Annual CSU Police Chiefs meeting in March 2007.
- Assist in the development of the new CAD/RMS System to maximize Operation Division Efficiency.
- Right Sizing the organization by adding additional police personnel to ensure the service needs of the community are being met.
- Develop on-going strategy to renew patrol vehicles.
- Increase patrol activities at Remote SDSU sites (SMER, IVC).
- Develop equipment inventory tracking system (automated).
- Continued partnership with Alcohol Enforcement Task force.
- Develop accountability models for effective use of police resources.
- Invest in opportunities for professional development of police officers, supervisory and management personnel (PMDP, SLI, Command College, National Academy & MIDP).



Administrative Division

Achievements in 2006:

- Disposed and processed thousands of pieces of property in our old station's evidence rooms.
- Investigators joined the East County Detectives Group to sharing intelligence and build a strong networking relationship.
- Communication systems were upgraded during the successful move to the new station and during the installation of equipment, the communications center was pre-wired for the upcoming third supervisor workstation.



- The Communication's staffing level of eight dispatchers was met by the fall of '06, including the addition of a second lead dispatcher.
- Passed and meet compliance criteria of the following Department audits: CSU Emergency Preparedness Planning, POST Training and Background Requirements, and DOJ NCIC validation.

Administrative Division

Goals & Objectives for 2007:

- Spearhead a successful transition to the new CAD/Records systems, including this summer's implementation of mobile computer devices in our patrol vehicles.
- Formally initiate a Strategic Planning Group by enhancing our policies and procedures to regional and national standards. Begin the process to become a nationally accredited police department.
- Investigators to join the NINS (Narcotics) network, and participate more in regional task force addressing narcotics, identity theft, and theft of valuable metals investigations.
- As part of the RIMS project, migrate the evidence and property materials management to a bar coded system, and continued to purging of dated materials and destruction of narcotics and other harmful matter as prescribed by law.
- Increase in staffing and resources in Dispatch, Records, and Investigations offices to support the *current* demands of the Operation's Division.
- Acceptance into the CA 9-1-1 Program to become a recognized and funded PSAP.



Auxiliary Division

Achievements in 2006:

- Completed move to new facility, with limited interruptions to business operations.
- Purchased and implement PC workstations throughout the department with support from BIDS and UCO.
- Right Size the bureau to ensure appropriate service levels are maintained.
- Initiate an employee development program to encourage, attract and mentor employees to excel.
- New citation AutoCite handhelds and software successfully implemented.
- Review services on an annual basis to ensure efficient and effective operations.
- Obtained materials and implement a professional recruitment document for distribution at orientations and job fairs.

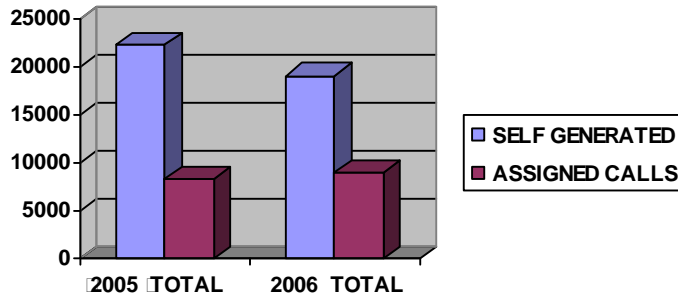

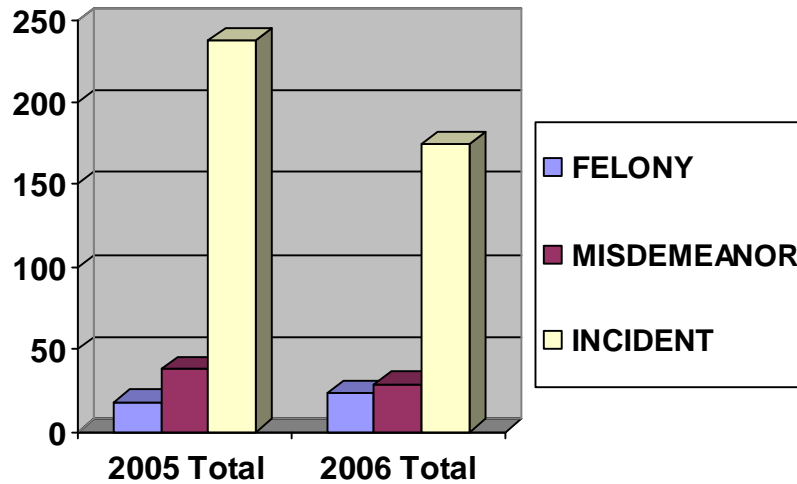
CALLS FOR SERVICE

2005 ~ 2006

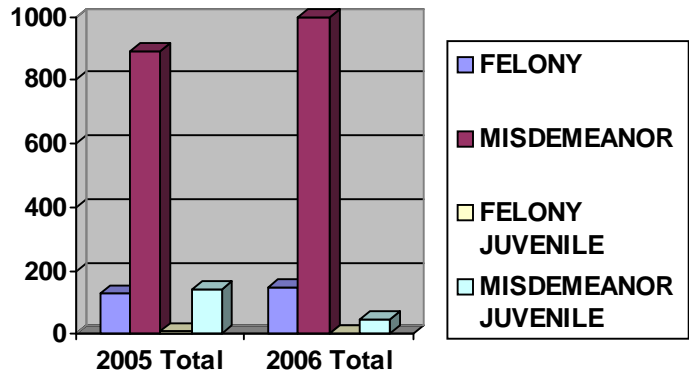

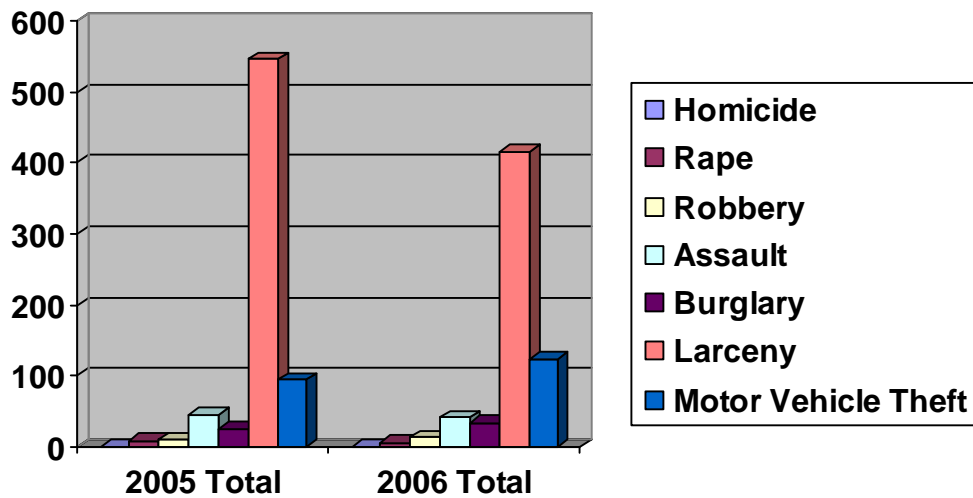

2005 ~2006

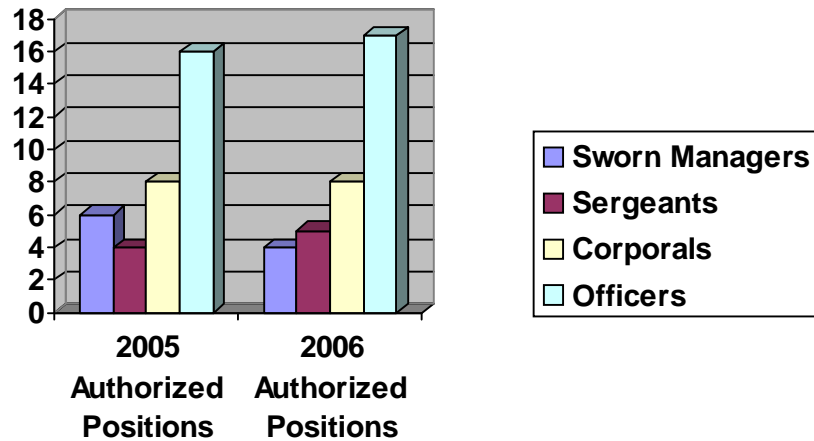


MAJOR CRIME STATISTICS
2005 ~ 2006



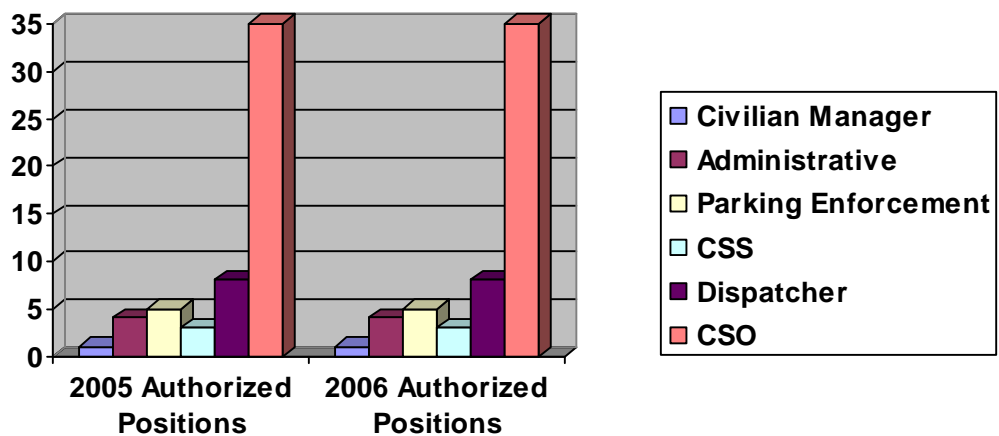
SWORN PERSONNEL

2005 ~ 2006

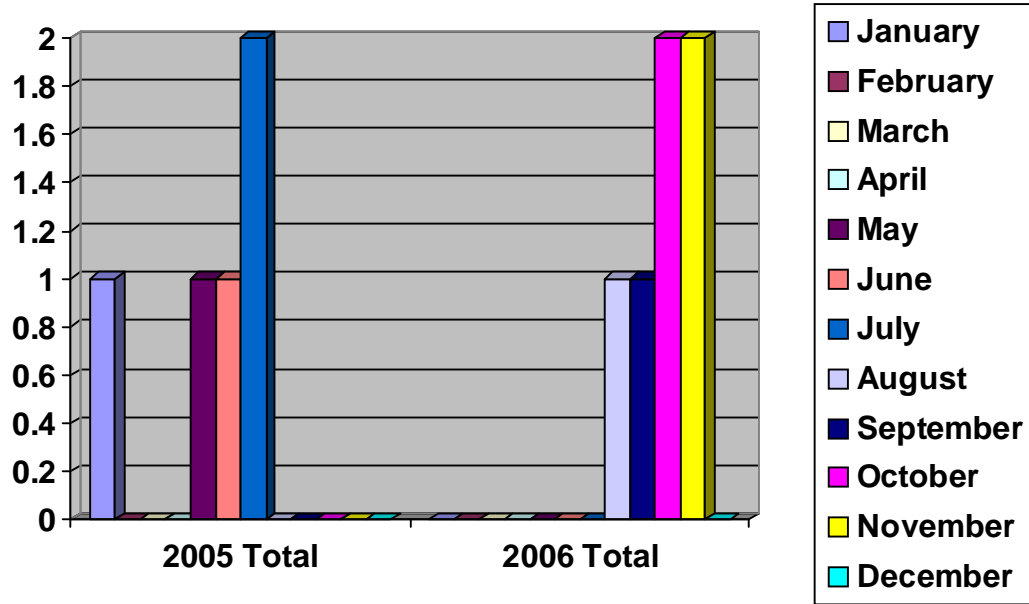


CIVILIAN PERSONNEL

2005 ~ 2006

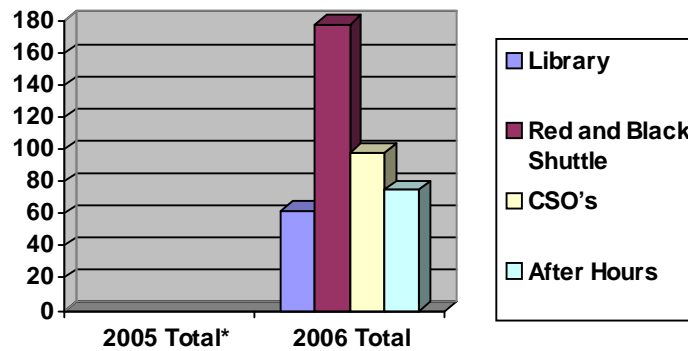


COMMUNITY COMMENTS

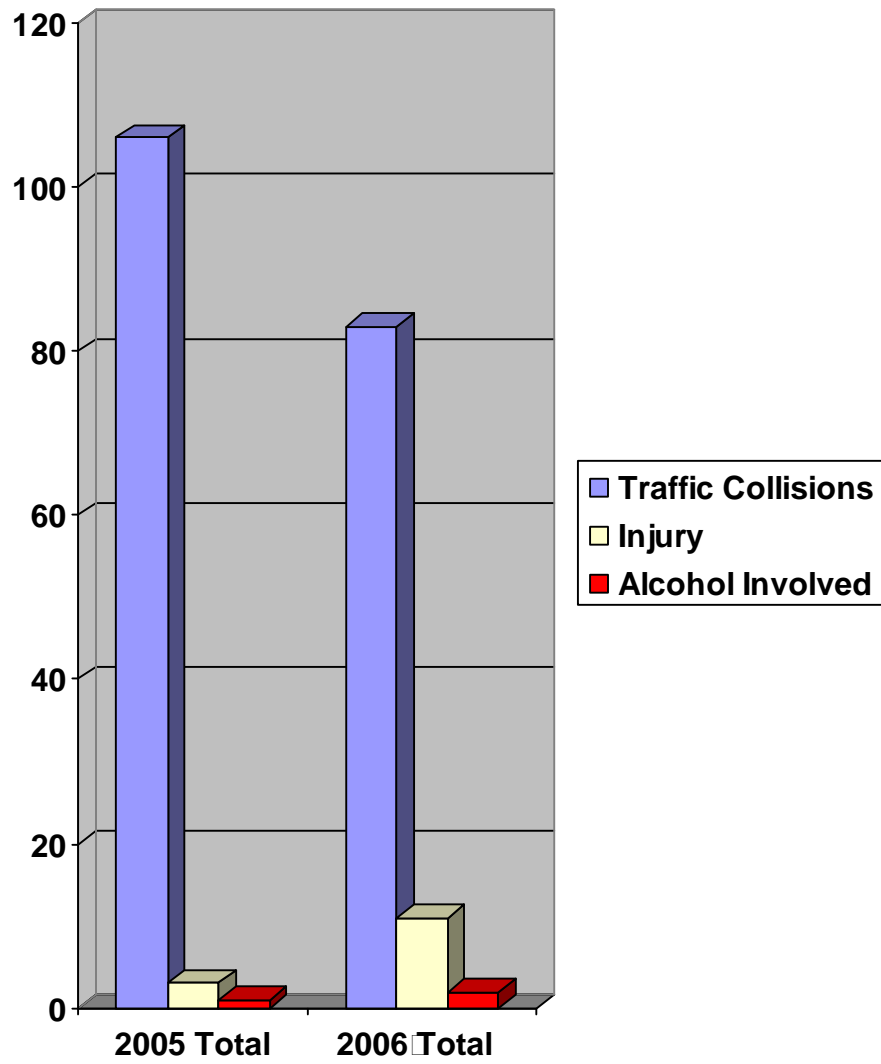

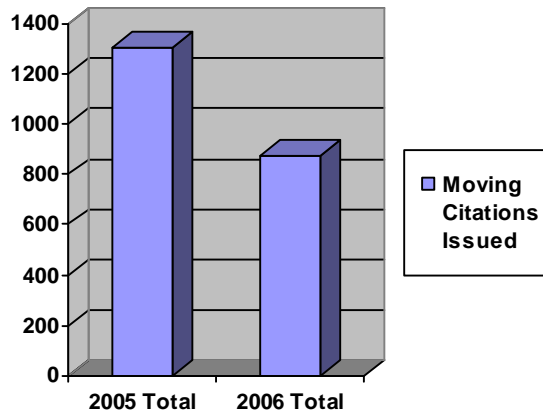

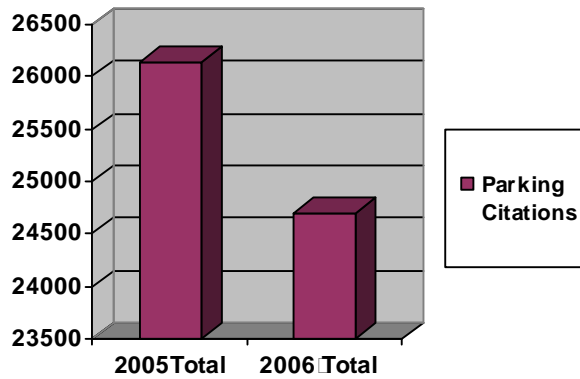
Traffic Collisions
2005 ~ 2006



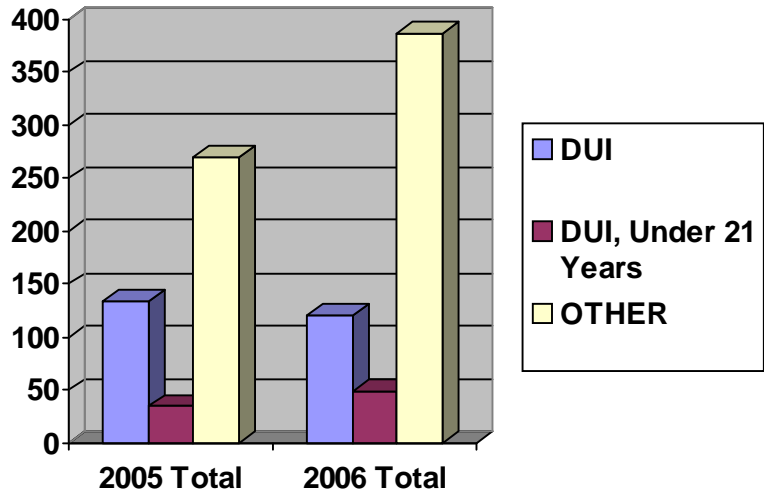
Moving Citations 2005 ~ 2006



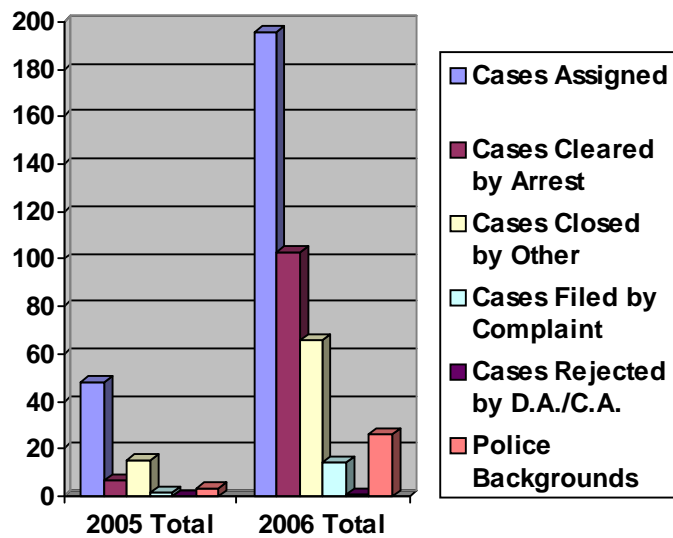
Parking Citations 2005 ~ 2006
